Our Mission

The International Piano Duo Association was established in 1989 with the aim of popularizing and promoting the field of piano duo, enhancing the art of piano duo, in an attempt to appeal to a wider audience. The following year, in 1990, a composition competition for piano duo works was held, followed by a performance competition for piano duo works in 1991. Since then, we have alternated between composition competitions and performance competitions.

In recent years, the piano duo genre has become more popular, and the number of performers specializing in piano duos has increased. Many professional players have emerged from the winners of this competition.

The 35th year of the association's foundation in 2024, we will increase the number of categories in hopes of further development of the piano duo world.

Categories and Eligibility for Application

Professional Category

[A] Piano Duo (1 piano 4 hands) [B] Two Pianos (2 pianos 4 hands)Over age 18 (Born before 2006, December 6)No upper age limits.Open to all nationalities.Past winners may participate (except for the past Grand Prize winners).

General Category

[A] Piano Duo (1 piano 4 hands) [B] Two Pianos (2 pianos 4 hands)Over age 18 (Born before July 13, 2006)No upper age limits.Open to all nationalities.

Youth Category

[A] Piano Duo (1 piano 4 hands)Junior high school and high school students (born between April 2, 2006 and April 1,2012).Any combination of grades is acceptable.Combination of junior high and high school students is also acceptable.Open to all nationalities.

Repertoire Requirements

Professional Category

Preliminary Round: Composition(s) of your choice between 6-10minutes. (Multiple pieces are accepted)

Final Round: A program of under 17 minutes. The program must include the required assigned composition, and the rest consisting free composition(s) of your choice.

- Only published works are accepted for the free compositions.
- Internal piano playing techniques (touching inside the piano or anywhere other than the keyboard) are not allowed.
- The contestants may switch parts (primo and secondo) between pieces.
- The piece(s) played in the preliminary round may be used again for the final round.
- Performing from memory is not required.

[Required Assigned Composition]

Suguru WAGATSUMA 「MAYOIGA ~for One Piano Four Hands~」

(The Grand Prix Composition of the 23rd International Piano Duo Competition <Composition Division>)

The work must be performed on 1 piano 4 hands.

General Category

Preliminary Round: Composition(s) of your choice between 6-8 minutes. (Multiple pieces are accepted) Final Round: Composition(s) of your choice between 6-10 minutes (different from those played in the Preliminary Round).

- Multiple pieces are accepted as long as it is within the time limit.
- Only published works are acceptable.
- The contestants may switch parts (primo and secondo) between pieces.
- Performing from memory is not required.

Youth Category

Preliminary Round: Composition(s) of your choice between 4-6 minutes. (Multiple pieces are accepted).

Final Round: A program of 8 minutes, including a piece from the selected repertoire list below. The rest of the program may consist of any 1 piano 4 hands composition(s) of contestant's choice.

• The free compositions in the Final Round must be different from those played in the preliminary round.

• You are required to play one piece from the Selected Required Repertoire list below. For the free compositions, you are free to choose any pieces, including those in the Selected Required Repertoire list.

• You may play as many pieces as you wish as long as it does not exceed the time limit.

• Do not play the repeats for the Selected Required Repertoire. For the free compositions, you may do as you wish.

• Only published works are accepted for the free compositions.
